On Feb 26th 2011, during an ideal weather window, The Rambler quietly slipped her moorings in the Outer Basin of Grand Canal Docks in Dublin and was locked through onto the Liffey.

On the Liffey, she turned right and headed out into Dublin Bay, passing 21st century ferries and container ships along the way.

A far different scene from her only recorded journey along this stretch, when in 1878 she entered Dublin, powered by her huge steam engine, at the end of a journey from Scotland. As John stated "..... the first sea trip in 133 years that has been recorded".
